## Technology & Cybersecurity: How to Design and Implement Strategies for Cyber Resilience and Readiness to Defend Against Advanced and Emerging Threats

Technology and data now permeate practically all aspects of business and operations, from customer data to intellectual property to HR records, and their use is not just limited to technology and IT companies. The workplace is increasingly a digital environment. The cyber risks inherent in such widespread reliance on technology are profound.

The threat from cyberattacks is significant and continuously evolving. Cybersecurity has grown into one of the most significant risk management challenges facing virtually every type of organisation. A survey in 2021 with CEOs revealed that cyber threats moved to number two on the list of external threats causing concerns for organisations. 90% of business leaders said they are concerned about cyber risks and the impact they could have on their organisations. Is the internal audit function keeping pace with this rapidly changing area of risk?

What are the strategies required to improve cyber resilience to resist cyberattacks? How are organisations preparing themselves? How can we learn from the lessons of others companies to advance cybersecurity?
